Transportation changes must be submitted in writing on the proper form (available at Front Desk & on our website) and handed into the Front Desk no later than 11 am for changes on that day.





Changing Means of Transportation


REMINDER: Due to the Jessica Lunsford Act, we are unable to accept transportation changes via phone calls/messages, text message, email, or voice mail. A Parent/ Guardian must give **advance written**, **dated**, **and signed notice using the "<u>Transportation</u> <u>Change Form</u>" to the school (Front Desk and homeroom teacher) when requesting any change in change in transportation. Please note it is not the responsibility of the homeroom teacher to make sure the "Transportation Change Form" is delivered to the Front Desk. There will be no exceptions**.

Prescription & Over The Counter

Medication Prescription medication will only be administered as approved by a physician. Two forms (Parent Request to Administer Medications and Medication Administration Record – available at the Front Desk) must be filled out and signed for the school to administer any over the counter or prescription medications.

Over the counter medication must be in an unopened, new container. Prescription medication must have prescription label on bottle/box. If assistance with non-prescription or over-the-counter medications is requested for periods of time over 3 days the school will require approval of a physician.

Medication will be counted and stored properly in the ORIGINAL CONTAINER under lock and key. **Medication shall not be carried on a student's person on the school grounds.**



R.E.S.P.E.C.T...

What is respect? Vocabulary.com states...

"Respect is a way of *treating or thinking about* something or someone. If you respect your teacher, you admire them and treat them well. People respect others who are impressive for any reason, such as being in authority — like a teacher or cop — or being older like a grandparent. "

Why is respect so important? Respect is an essential part of human life. It is the foundation of leading a society and having a society. Without respect you cannot have leaders you trust, whether it is family, community, or political leaders. It's an unspoken way of communication which builds unshaken and strong relations between people respecting each other. When a person shows respect for someone, it means they value that person. Their advice and suggestions are important. Respect is seeing someone, flaws and all, and still feeling appreciation of their unique talents, gifts and insights.

Ever hear, "to get respect you have to give respect"? 
