# **Daily Details** FSAs (Florida Standard Assessment)

All public schools and public charters in Florida will be participating in the upcoming FSAs...

Testing has already started and will continue as follows...

Mar 27<sup>th</sup> – 29<sup>th</sup> Apr 17<sup>th</sup> – May 18<sup>th</sup>

These dates include FSA makeup days. All students will not test every day. Teachers will inform parents of grade level test schedule.

You can help us on testing days by making sure your student eats a balanced diet (low in sugar), drinks enough water, is well rested, and arrives by7:45 am for school. Students arriving late will not be permitted in the testing rooms and will have to make up the test being administered at that time on the designated retake days.

Talk to your child about the importance of the tests! Don't place so much pressure on doing well that the child panics the day of the test. Your child has been learning what they need to know since the first day of school. Make sure your child gets enough sleep the night before the tests. Help your child start test mornings as positively as possible. If disorganization is an issue, make sure that pencils, papers and clothes are ready the night before. A few extra minutes of time may be beneficial so that your student will be more relaxed instead of "rushed".

Electronic devices are not permitted in the testing room. <u>Students must leave cell phones at home.</u>

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# Doing Our Part...

When I was a little, we lived in California, near Disneyland. We could actually see the evening fireworks from our roof. That was as close as we usually got being a family of 5 at the time. During a rare visit to Disneyland, I discovered that one of my favorite attractions was the Carousel of Progress, specifically Progress City (the original dream for EPCOT) in Tomorrowland.

First off, what a future dream it was (to a child in 1964) with everything a future city would need for work, leisure, and daily life all laid out in miniature. I was so impressed by the detail of the tiny city and how everything seemed to move in perfect harmony with everything else. Traffic lights turned green, cars moved, and the city activity changed while it went through an accelerated day and night. It was amazed me how every little piece was doing its part and how all those little pieces were interdependent upon each other. I could see how if one of those pieces didn't function properly, it would affect a good portion of the city.

It was a very memorable "aha" moment. Today, while sitting in traffic, mentally pushing down on the gas peddles of the cars in front of me (with no results... sigh), it reminded me of how each of us is a tiny part of our local community. And that community is a tiny part of Earth's community. And just like in the miniature city, if one of us stops in our tracks and doesn't advance, grow, and thrive, a part of that community also stops, becomes stagnant and drags down the surrounding Earthly community.

For me, that translates to, if I don't keep doing my part, advancing and growing myself despite what others around me may do, then I am stagnating my local community (my family, my work, my friends, the list is endless). So even though I am just one person, if as one person, I don't do my part, help out, work, and grow, it is impossible for any one of my communities to consistently grow. And what if two, five, or ten people don't do their part? Those communities are affected even more.

So looking at the big picture (as I did that day so long ago), I can definitely see how one person can make a difference in their communities either as a productive member or an unproductive member. Do you make a productive or unproductive difference?
