IMPORTANT TESTING REMINDERS!


Please be sure ...

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Daily Details FSAs (Florida Standard Assessment)

All public schools and public charters in Florida participate in the FSAs. Testing for 3rd - 8th has already started and will continue as follows...

Mar 27th - 29th Apr 17th - May 18th

These dates include FSA makeup days. All students will not test every day. Teachers will inform parents of grade level test schedule.

You can help us on testing days by making sure your student eats a balanced diet (low in sugar), drinks enough water, is well rested, and arrives by 7:45 am for school.

Talk to your child about the importance of the tests! Don't place so much pressure on doing well that the child panics the day of the test. Your child has been learning what they need to know since the first day of school. Make sure your child gets enough sleep the night before the tests (and all other days, as well). Help your child start test mornings as positively as possible. If disorganization is an issue, make sure that pencils, papers and clothes are ready the night before. A few extra minutes of time may be beneficial so that the child will be more relaxed instead of "rushed".

Electronic devices are not permitted in the testing room. Students must leave cell phones at home.

Students arriving late will not be permitted in the testing rooms and will have to make up the test being administered at that time on the designated retake days.


Strings






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Paying Attention...

So, I stopped to get a bagel in the morning at my usual place. The attendant gave me the total. I reached down to unzip my bag (I use a camera bag as a purse) and get out my wallet. Funny, the zipper was not where I remembered it. I focused completely on my bag. It was the correct size, but the configuration seemed different. I kept looking at it and suddenly I realized it was the wrong bag, it wasn't even the same color. I had used my camera over the weekend and put it down next to my baa. I didn't notice at 6 am that there were two bags and I grabbed the wrong one. The attendant was very nice and allowed me to pay the next morning.

Going through life, most of us feel we are paying attention all the time. Some of us even feel that our attention span abilities are so great they allow us to multi task easily. Actually, studies have shown we can't do two things at once, consciously. We may think we are multitasking, but in reality, we are just switching our attention very quickly between activities. Studies also show that even though we think we are very focused and aware of what is going on, our brains are focused only 50% of the time. The other 50% of the time our minds wander. 50%?? What is going on?

In the first place, our minds were designed this way. It was essential that we be able to switch focus instantly in order to run away or defend against the saber toothed tiger that had snuck up on us. We don't have saber toothed tigers any longer, but we do have the imminent threat of news flashes, texts, or any other information that might come across our cell phones.

So how do we focus more and wander less? 1. Meditation puts your mind in the moment keeping it from worrying about the future or dwelling over the past. 2. Exercise helps improve your mood and also reduces anxiety and worry. 3. Be mindful of what you think about. Do you wonder if you got the chicken out for dinner while you are driving in traffic? 4. Retrain your mind. Once you are more aware of your thoughts, make a conscious effort to redirect your thoughts back to what you wish to focus on. 5. Get plenty of sleep. Most adults now (I am one of them) do not get enough sleep. Proper rest makes it easier for your mind to pay attention and work properly. 6. Take a break. If during work your mind flits from task to worry, stop and stretch, breathe deeply in and out a few times, close your eyes and focus on your breathing.


So, next time you look down and see you have the wrong bag, try some of the tips above to get back on track and make what you pay attention to your choice.


