



#### Uniforms

PBA is a uniform school. To be considered in uniform; students will be wearing a Palm Bay Academy uniform shirt (with logo) and bottoms in the school color designated for that campus or program. Shirts will be tucked in. Shoes will be of plain color (no light ups, wheelies or distracting character images) and sandals of any sort. When sweaters/jackets are worn, they will be in appropriate school colors. In cold weather, sweat pants or tights in the designated color (no patterns or stripes) for that campus or program are allowed.

#### **Medicines**


PBA is not allowed to dispense prescription or over the counter medicines without the proper forms filled out by the parent/guardian. Children are not allowed to have medicines in their possession. Parents must bring in the medicines and fill out the forms before they can be dispensed. Prescriptions must be with medicines and over the counter medicine must be in an unopened container.

### Attendance, Absences, Tardies

Students are in their seats and class has started by 7:40. Students are marked tardy after 8:05. Students must be in attendance (in the classroom, not the clinic or front office) for four hours of curriculum time to be marked present for the day. If they are late or checked out early and not present for four hours, they are marked absent. If your child is going to be absent, please call and let the front desk know before 8:00 am that day. It is understood that students may be absent on occasion. Children are allowed 4 unexcused absences per quarter and 9 unexcused absences per semester.

#### **Breakfast and Lunches**

PBA serves breakfast from 7:25 am to 7:55 am. If you are going to be tardy, please call in before 8:30 to order your child's lunch. Extra lunches are not ordered for children who are not in the seats when lunch counts are taken in morning. PBA provides FRFF lunch & breakfast to all PBA students.







































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# Stay Sharp During Summer...

Research shows that students lose academic skills over the summer. It's one of the most significant causes of the achievement gap and one of the strongest contributors to the high school dropout rate.

Students can lose two to three months in reading skills and most students lose about two months of math skills during the summer break. These reading and math losses add up. By fifth grade, summer learning loss can leave some students 2 1/2 to 3 years behind their peers.

What can we do about this? Keep your kids actively learning all summer long! Incorporate some of the following ideas into your daily summer routine...

- 1. Read: Visit the library often. Allow children to choose their own books. Have "Family Reading Time" where everyone reads and perhaps older siblings can read to younger ones.
- 2. Write: When my daughter was younger, we used to hold "Afternoon Writing" outside. Her friends would come over. Everyone got a pad and a pencil. We would pick topics like; Where is your favorite place to visit and why? My favorite summer activity is..., If you could take a trip anywhere, where would you go and why? Once everyone finished writing we would read our answers aloud. Writing letters to friends and family is another good way to practice and it's fun taking the letters to be mailed and receiving replies.
- 3. Math & Science: Baking is an excellent way to incorporate both of these concepts. Have your child(ren) read the recipe and measure out the ingredients. Talk about the chemical reaction that happens in the mix when certain ingredients are added and baked, like baking soda or eggs. You can have your child(ren) add up the amount of the groceries before you get to the checkout counter, then see how close they were. Take your kids stargazing and look for constellations using an app like Google Sky or a star chart for your region. Learn about plants indigenous to your area and take a nature walk to see how many you can identify.

The summer break is an exceptional time for parents to stop learning loss and get their children a step ahead for the coming year. Be sure to make it fun!

### Immunizations...



2017-2018 dosage requirements are as follows; 4 or 5 doses DTaP (last dose must be after age 4), 3-5 doses Polio (last dose must be after age 4), 2 doses MMR, 3 doses Hep B, 2 doses K or Varicella (K-6 and those retained in 5th), 1 dose Tdap (7-12).















### **Riddles**
