School Uniforms

The school uniform for the Traditional Elementary School is; Navy blue bottoms, white or navy socks/tights, and a white Palm Bay Academy shirt with the Palm Bay Academy logo. Outerwear will be white, navy, or gray.

- 2. BRIGHTLY COLORED OR PATTERNED TIGHTS AND SOCKS ARE NOT PERMITTED!
- 3. LIGHTUP SHOES OR WHEELIES ARE NOT PERMITTED! Tights, long pants and sweat pants need to be the appropriate color for the school uniform bottoms.
- 4. SUBSTITUTING BEIGE KHAKI BOTTOMS FOR THE REQUIRE NAVY BLUE IS NOT PERMITTED!

Repeated infractions will result in field trip privileges being suspended and could result in further consequences, possibly including suspension.

Finger Pointing is Pointless...

Gas is under \$2 here in Palm Bay! Yea! It feels great when we appreciate the good things that happen. And it feels awful when we notice the bad things that happen. Like when we are upset enough to point fingers (in actuality or figuratively) at others. Usually, we are not pointing out a serious felony or some horrendous incident. Usually we are pointing at someone or something that we feel has wronged us in some way.

So, why do we point fingers at others? It helps us feel justified and "right" because it deflects blame from ourselves. The most recent incident in our household was a quibble between me, my husband and our daughter. The quibble continued to escalate with each figuratively pointing out why the other was wrong. "You said that." "No, I said this." In actuality, there was no right or wrong and in as little as a week or two the incident would be forgotten.

We don't like to admit our own failings. It makes us feel weak and at one time weak meant you didn't live very long. Of course now we don't live in as threatening a world. For lots of us, the most challenging thing we face in a day is getting a traffic ticket or having a disagreement with someone. Some of us live in more challenging circumstances but even these are a far cry from being chased by a Tyrannosaurus Rex.

Lily Daub on the website, The Seeds 4 Life has a great take on this... "How easy it is for us to point at each other and criticize one another's shortcomings, flaws, and wrong doings ... our hurts and disappointments? While we are blaming and criticizing others, we are forgetting one important fact: when we point the finger at someone, three of them are pointed right back at us. They point back at us to remind us that regardless of who or what we may feel is responsible for our current state and situation, ultimately, the responsibility is ours. We have three times more control and responsibility than the one we point our finger to."

This is a reassuring point (no pun intended) of view. When we take responsibility it gives us control over our lives and when we are in control we can change things for the better. So, why not change critical finger pointing into extending an open hand in understanding. Besides finger pointing is pointless. It rarely solves anything.


PBA Offers Parents Night Out!


